Fulton County Senior Center Gets a New Ride

The Fulton County Senior Center has purchased a new "used" 25 passenger bus to be used for transporting seniors on outings, trips and to events. "We have seen an increase in the seniors desire to just go and try new things," states Sheri Rychener, Senior Center director. The Senior Center had been operating with just a 12 seat bus, and often-times was needing to pull vehicles from their medical transportation program. Rychener notes that the details involved in planning trips is extensive and knowing that they now have access to a bus will provide the capabilities to add more local trips. "I have heard stories of trips that some of our seniors took years ago. For a time, the trips were discontinued, but their memories lasted. They are thrilled to be able to participate again...and they just think it's fun to get on a bus together!"

Training Lab.
